

The WealthWorks Northwest Initiative

RDI is a member of the growing community of practice that is using the WealthWorks framework to achieve measurable results on the ground. The WealthWorks approach is not a cookie-cutter or a recipe; it is a framework that is intended to be strategically impactful while doing no harm.

The Rural Pacific Northwest, with its abundance of both natural and human resources, is primed to take advantage of the systems approach and value chain opportunities WealthWorks provides.

WWNW begins with four regional workshops to introduce the approach and facilitate regional exploration around the WWNW opportunity:

- Regional groups will apply for one of five technical assistance grants to explore regional assets and opportunities to develop value chains, establish a local collaborative network with shared interests and outcomes, and complete a request for assistance to construct their value chain.
- At least one of the strongest grassroots, regional requests will be selected for value chain construction and investment.
- The value chain construction and implementation phase will include WealthWorks technical assistance and coaching to the backbone organization and collaborative, deliberate inclusion of low-income participants, establishment of measures and strategies to build wealth that sticks in eight capitals, removal of barriers, and investments made in value chain businesses.
- During WWNW there will be ongoing measurement and evaluation at two levels; at a systems level to determine the effectiveness of this model to increase wealth in rural areas of the Pacific Northwest and at the local level measuring the wealth created in the eight capitals.
